RE: **REVISED** Greek Grade Report for Spring Semester 2007
(NOTE: Due to recent roster updates the previous reports and some individual chapter GPAs may have changed. Please reports dated May 14, 2007 as the final data.)

Congratulations on behalf of Fraternity and Sorority Life. This letter contains information regarding grades for all fraternities and sororities on campus. After you have had an opportunity to review the information please contact our office with questions.

We would like to begin by congratulating the three organizations with the highest GPA. **Alpha Kappa Alpha / Kappa Alpha Theta tied (3.215) and Kappa Kappa Gamma (3.184)** had the highest chapter grade point averages.

Next we would like to recognize the top three GPA's for fraternities and sororities.
Fraternities: **Beta Theta Pi (3.164), Theta Chi (3.110), and Alpha Epsilon Pi (2.969)**
Sororities: **Alpha Kappa Alpha and Kappa Alpha Theta (3.215) and Kappa Kappa Gamma (3.184)**

Reading the Table: For your convenience, the grade report is divided into three separate columns: Initiated, Associates/New Members and Overall Chapter. Within these columns are the number of actives or new members, the actual grade point average, and the rank among all the organizations (either fraternity or sorority).

Setting Goals: All four governing councils need to be proactive with scholastic achievement. It is the expectation of Fraternity and Sorority Life that **every chapter will require new members and any other members on academic probation to attend the Greek Student Success Program.** Some chapters need to work harder to improve their overall GPA. Special attention needs to be given to members who earn below a 2.0 GPA. In addition, all new member classes must strive to achieve a 2.5 GPA. Assisting members with their academic success and showing progress towards achieving a degree is essential to each chapter's mission!

*(*Includes only those students who are 17 through 24 years of age. Thus, the majority of fraternity and sorority members are being compared with the same classification or age group of students.)*

Other Interesting Information:

- ◆ 30% of the sorority women were on the Dean's List and 5% earned a 5.0 (President's List)
- ◆ 18% of the fraternity men were on the Dean's List and 3% earned a 4.0 (President's List)
- ◆ 25% of the total Greek community made the Dean's List, while 4% earned a 4.0 (President's List)
- ◆ 92% of the sorority women were listed as full-time students (those enrolled in 12 or more hours)
- ◆ 88% of the fraternity men were listed as full-time students (those enrolled in 12 or more hours)
- ◆ 90% of the total Greek population were listed as full-time students (those enrolled in 12 or more hours)

Those chapter members that did not complete the term, or did not have any hours for an average were listed separately on the individual chapter grade report. These individual's statistics were not figured in your chapter's overall GPA. Additionally, you may find that some chapter members were not on the grade report. While we may have overlooked them, chances are they did not appear on your updated list.

In closing, Fraternity and Sorority Life has a variety of resources available to chapters and members of the Greek Community.
