RE: Greek Grade Report Spring Semester 2009

Congratulations on behalf of Fraternity and Sorority Life. This letter contains information regarding grades for all fraternities and sororities on campus. After you have had an opportunity to review the information please contact our office with questions.

We would like to begin by congratulating the three organizations with the highest overall semester GPA: **Alpha Delta Pi (3.278), Kappa Alpha Theta (3.272) and Delta Sigma Theta (3.243).**

Next we would like to recognize the top three GPA's for fraternities and sororities.

Fraternities: **Alpha Tau Omega (3.062), Beta Theta Pi (3.051) and Theta Chi (3.042)**

Sororities: **Alpha Delta Pi (3.278), Kappa Alpha Theta (3.272) and Delta Sigma Theta (3.243)**

Reading the Table: For your convenience, the grade report is divided into three separate columns: Initiated, Associates/New Members and Overall Chapter. Within these columns are the number of actives or new members, the actual grade point average, and the rank among all the organizations (either fraternity or sorority).

Setting Goals: All governing councils need to be proactive with scholastic achievement and our Standards of Excellence requirements. It is the expectation of Fraternity and Sorority Life that **every chapter will require new members and any other members on academic probation to attend academic success workshops or the Greek Student Success Program.** Some chapters need to work harder to improve their overall GPA. Special attention needs to be given to members who earn below a 2.5 GPA. In addition, all new member classes must strive to achieve a 2.5 GPA. Assisting members with their academic success and showing progress towards achieving a degree is essential to each chapter's mission! All chapters falling below the overall chapter total 2.5 GPA will be required to meet with the Director of F&SL to discuss future academic goals and chapter consequences.

*(*Includes only those students who are 17 through 24 years of age. Thus, the majority of fraternity and sorority members are being compared with the same classification or age group of students.)*

Other Interesting Information:

- ◆ 32% of the sorority women were on the Dean's List and 7.5% earned a 4.0 (President's List)
- ◆ 20% of the fraternity men were on the Dean's List and 3.5% earned a 4.0 (President's List)
- ◆ 26% of the total Greek community made the Dean's List, while 5.6% earned a 4.0 (President's List)
- ◆ 93% of the sorority women were listed as full-time students (those enrolled in 12 or more hours)
- ◆ 89% of the fraternity men were listed as full-time students (those enrolled in 12 or more hours)
- ◆ 91% of the total Greek population were listed as full-time students (those enrolled in 12 or more hours)

Those chapter members that did not complete the term, or did not have any hours for an average were listed separately on the individual chapter error report. These individual's statistics were not figured in your chapter's overall GPA. Additionally, you may find that some chapter members were not on the grade report. While we may have overlooked them, chances are they did not appear on your updated roster submitted to F&SL. Please contact F&SL for any missing grades or roster corrections.

In closing, Fraternity and Sorority Life has a variety of resources available to chapters and members of the Greek Community. Please stop by and visit with us if your chapter needs assistance in presenting an academic success program or getting pointers on how to increase your chapter's GPA. ACADEMIC STANDING CODES

Please note that one of the columns on the grade report printout is academic standing or “Acad Stnd.” You will want to refer to the below academic standing key. Below is a brief synopsis of academic standing classifications.

Academic Warning: Some first time in college applicants who do not meet university admission requirements may be admitted on academic warning. By obtaining a 2.0 or better at the end of their first semester of attendance, academic warning will be removed. A student can be on academic warning only once.

Academic Probation: Action taken when a student’s UCF GPA drops below a 2.0. Probation will continue until the current term and UCF GPA reach a 2.0 or better.

Disqualified: A student is “disqualified” upon failure to achieve a 2.0 GPA during the subsequent semester. A student who is disqualified may not enroll at the University for two semesters following disqualification.

Exclusion (second suspension): A student readmitted following disqualification who fails to achieve a 2.0 GPA is “excluded” from the university. Readmission will not be considered prior to a minimum suspension period of one year.

IMPORTANT

Students on academic warning and probation are not considered “students in good standing” with the university. A student “not in good standing” may not hold a leadership position in an organization, or be considered for such (i.e. an elected Executive Board member position with a chapter, DGC, IFC, Panhellenic or NPHC) during that specific time period.

Students that are disqualified or excluded are not considered “currently enrolled” at the University of Central Florida. Membership in any student organization is limited to any student who is currently paying fees and enrolled at UCF. *In addition these individuals should not be residing in on campus housing, including the chapter houses located in Greek Park.*

Please make sure that your chapter officers, leaders and chapter members meet the basic criteria for leadership positions and membership. We encourage our fraternal organizations to set higher standards or requirements for leadership and membership than that of the university.
